To strengthen their capacity, the PREMIERE project, in collaboration with the EU-FarmBook, is launching a Train-the-Trainers workshop focused on the **Multi-Actor Approach (MAA)** – a core methodology for co-creating impactful, collaborative projects involving practitioners and (end-)users alongside academia, industry, public authorities, and civil society actors.

WHY JOIN US

This hands-on training equips you with skills and practical tools to better support your teams and researchers in designing clear, collaborative, and well-structured multi-actor projects.

The training will focus on:

- **Understanding and applying the MAA** into practical guidance and effective support for applicants.
- Practical approaches to identify, attract and **engage practice actors**, users, and other key stakeholders in co-creating successful proposals.
- **Improving proposal quality, dissemination of project results and impact:**
- **Facilitate collaboration and effective cooperation** between researchers and practice actors throughout the project.

WHAT TO EXPECT

If selected, you will be expected to: attend a 90-min online preparation workshop; participate in the **full 2-day face-to face training in Zaragoza, Spain (26 and 27 May 2026)**; and act as multiplier within your organisation and transferring the **knowledge and skills gained**.

This **two-day face-to-face training** is structured around interactive and experience-based learning methods. Through a combination of real-life simulation, group exercises, and peer exchange, you will gain practical skills and methodological tools to effectively support the development of multi-actor projects.

WHO SHOULD APPLY

This training is specifically designed for research support, knowledge transfer and administration officers within universities and research institutes across the 27 EU Member States who assist in the development of Horizon Europe multi-actor projects.

Travel and accommodation costs for all participants will be covered and participants from widening countries are strongly encouraged to apply
